CLARESHOLM GLAUCONITIC Q OIL UNIT (Effective as of the Effective Date)

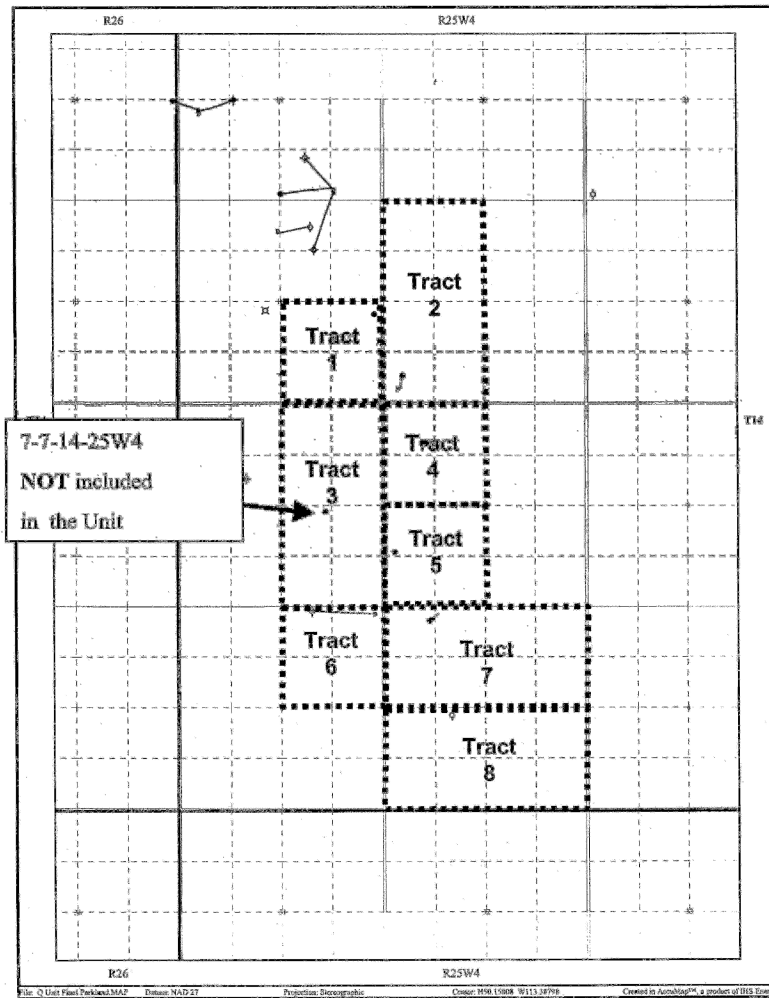
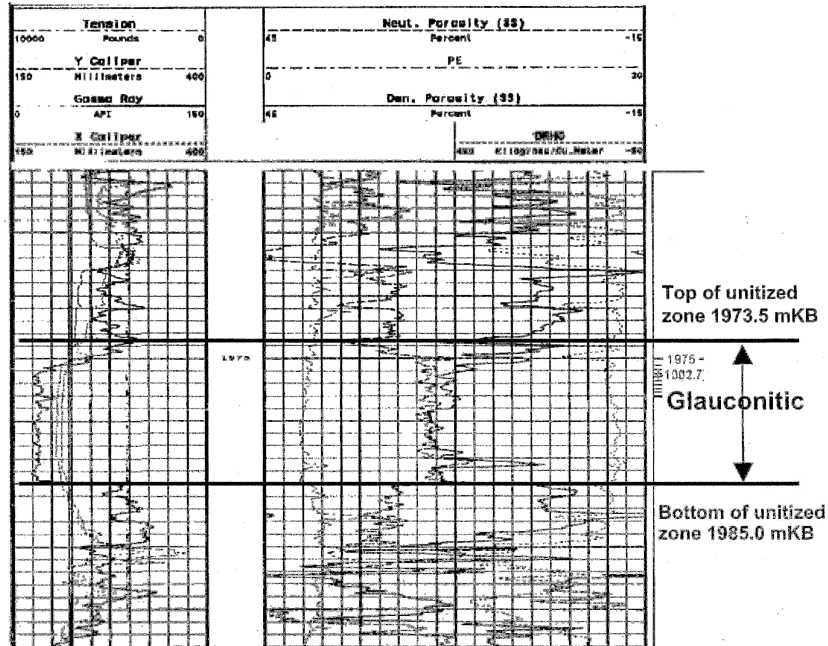
