Contract Increases Approved Pursuant to Treasury Board Directive 08/93

Contract No: 5846/04

Contractor: Carmacks Enterprises Ltd.

Reason for Increase: This contract involves grading, granular base course, asphalt concrete pavement (EPS) and other work on Highway 9:04 – E. of Hwy. 840 to Drumheller. Additional quantities of paving items were required to address the rapid continual deterioration of the roadway pavement surface. Additional excavation quantities were required due to unanticipated large volumes of waste material in the widening sections.
