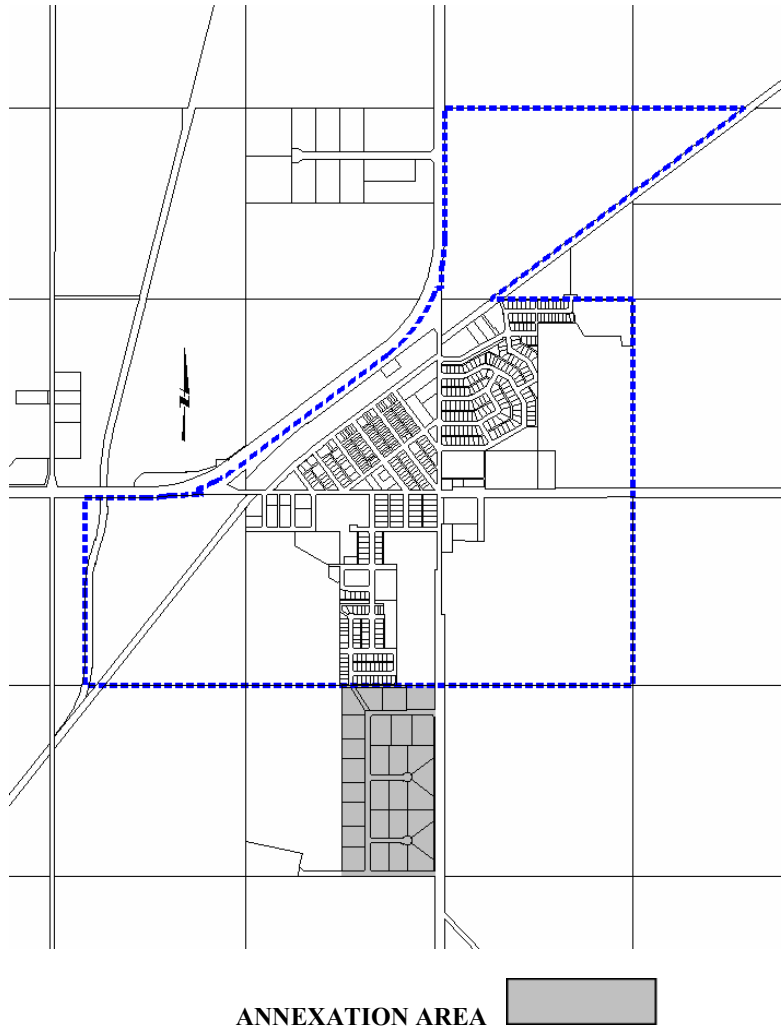

ACRES) MORE OR LESS.

ALL THAT PORTION OF THE ACCESS ROAD LYING ADJACENT TO
THE SOUTHERN BOUNDARY OF THE EAST ONE-HALF, SOUTHEAST
QUARTER OF SECTION THIRTY-THREE (33), TOWNSHIP SIXTY-FOUR
(64), RANGE NINETEEN (19), WEST OF THE FOURTH MERIDIAN,

**APPENDIX C
ORDER**

- 1 In this Order, “annexed land” means the land described in Appendix A and shown on the sketch in Appendix B.
- 2 For taxation purposes in 2009 and subsequent years up to and including 2018, the annexed land and assessable improvements to it
 - (a) must be assessed by the Village of Boyle on the same basis as if they had remained in The County of Athabasca No. 12, and
 - (b) must be taxed by the Village of Boyle in respect of each assessment class that applies to the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it using the municipal tax rate established by The County of Athabasca No. 12.
- 3 Where in any taxation year, up to and including 2018, a portion of the annexed land
 - (a) becomes a new parcel of land created as the result of subdivision or separation of title by registered plan of subdivision or by instrument or any other method that occurs at the request of, or on behalf of, the landowner, or
 - (b) becomes a residual portion of 3 acres or less after a new parcel referred to in clause (a) has been created,section 2 ceases to apply at the end of that taxation year in respect of that portion of the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it.
- 4 After section 2 ceases to apply to a portion of the annexed land in a taxation year, that portion of the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it must be assessed and taxed for the purposes of property taxes in the following year in the same manner as other property of the same assessment class in the Village of Boyle is assessed and taxed.

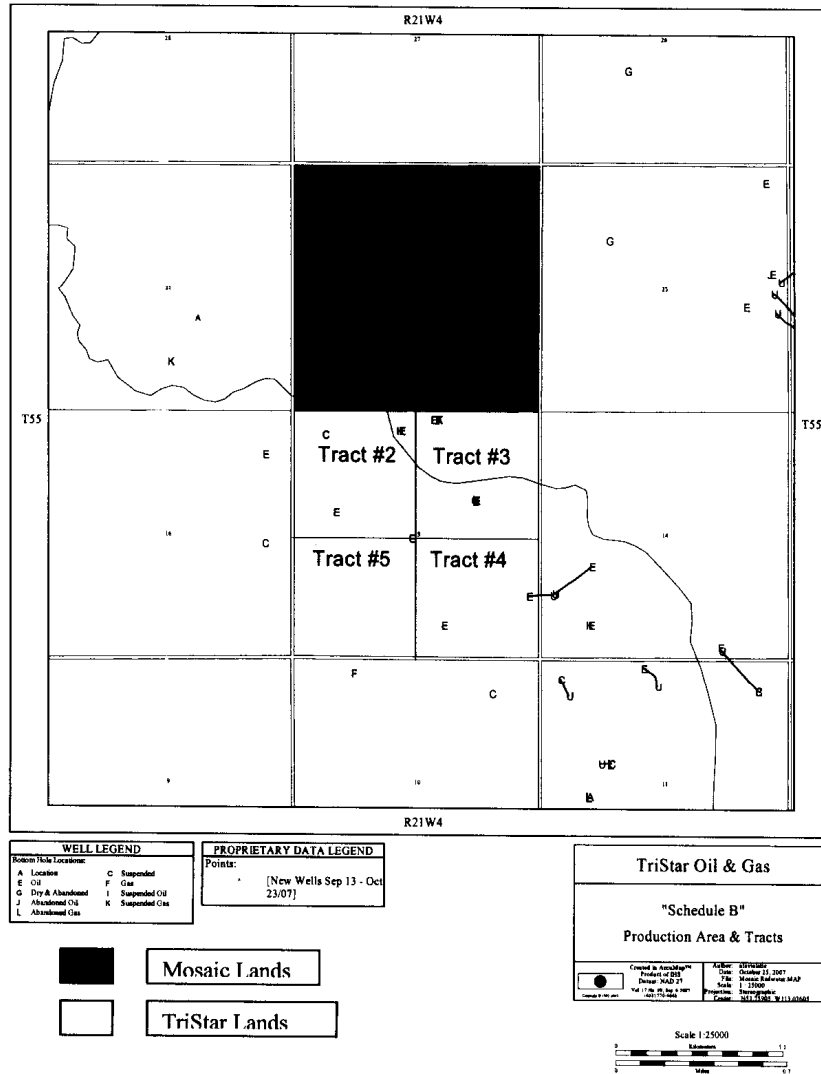
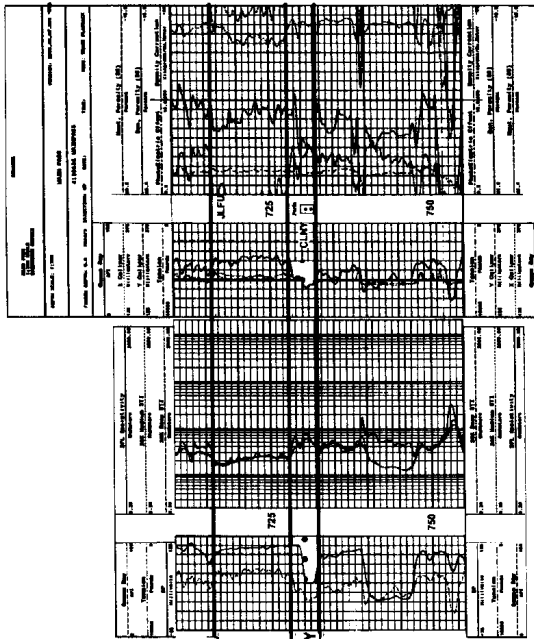
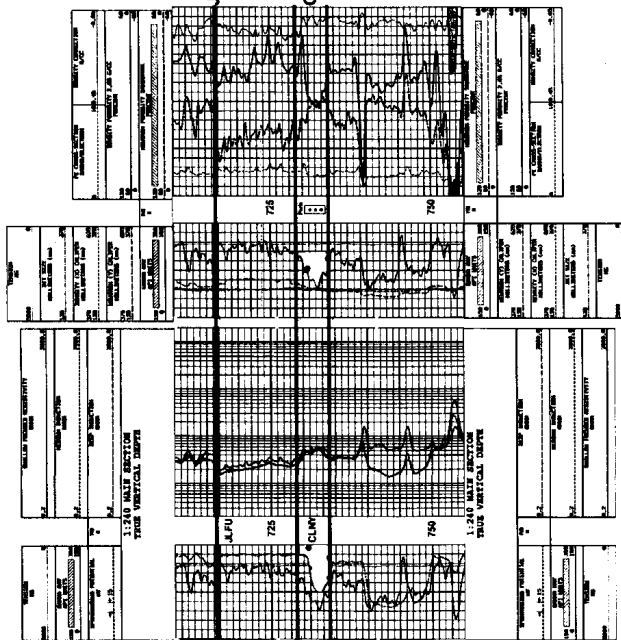
