Rock Lake Provincial Park Order

The lands described in the Schedule of Lands are designated as a provincial park to be known as Rock Lake Provincial Park.

Schedule of Lands

Rock Lake Provincial Park

All those parcels or tracts of land, situate, lying, and being in the fifty-second (52) township, in the second (2) range, west of the sixth (6) meridian, in the Province of Alberta, Canada, and being composed of:

The north west quarter and legal subdivision five (5) of section four (4), sections five (5) and six (6) and the south west quarter of section nine (9), all those portions of sections seven (7) and eight (8) and the north west quarter of section nine (9) lying generally to the south of the left bank of the Wildhay River, all those portions of the north east quarter of section four (4), the south east quarter of section nine (9), the south half of section ten (10), section eleven (11) and the north west quarter of section twelve (12) lying generally to the north of the right bank of the said Wildhay River, all those portions of the north east quarter of section nine (9), the north half of section ten (10), section fourteen (14) and the south east quarter of section fifteen

(15), lying generally to the south and east of a theoretical line drawn at a uniform distance of 400 meters measured perpendicular to and generally to the north and west of the northwesterly limit of the Rock Lake road, as shown upon a map or plan of record in the Department of Sustainable Resource Development at Edmonton as No. 295F and all those portions of section thirteen (13) lying generally to the north and west of the right bank of the said Wildhay River and to the south and east of the said theoretical line drawn at a uniform distance of 400 meters measured perpendicular to and generally to the north and west of the northwesterly limit of the said Rock Lake road, as shown upon the said map or plan of record in the Department of Sustainable Resource Development at Edmonton as No. 295F.

The lands herein described contain one thousand six hundred sixty-one and nine hundred fifteen thousandths (1661.915) hectares (4106.68 acres), more or less.

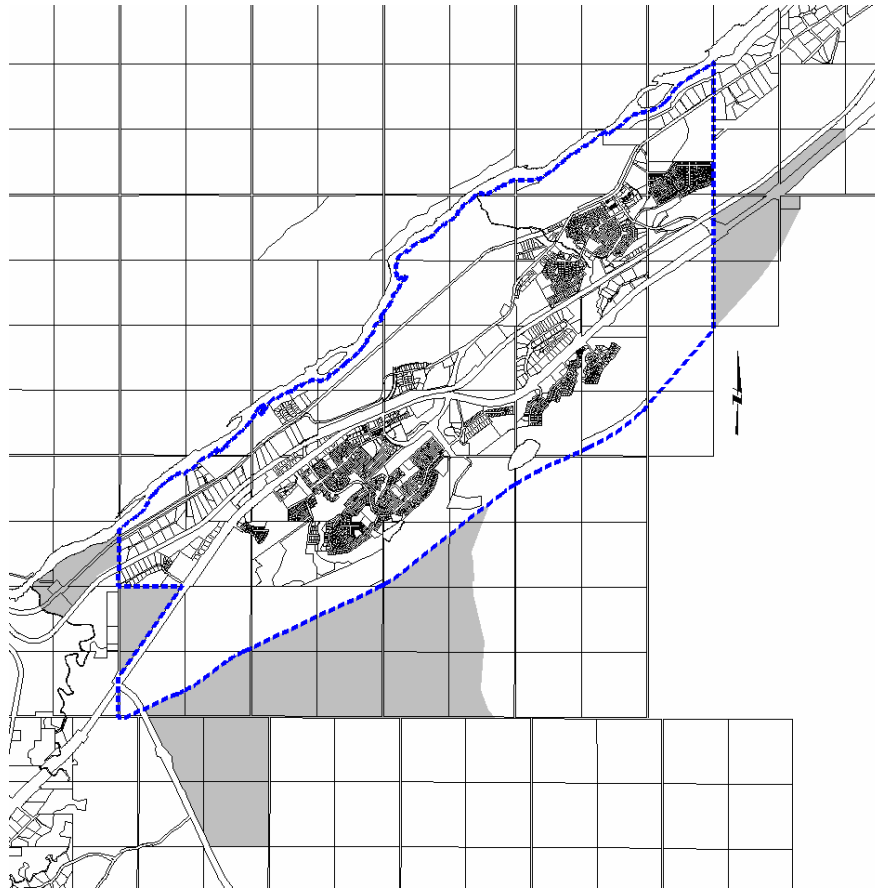

ANNEXED TO THE TOWN OF HINTON

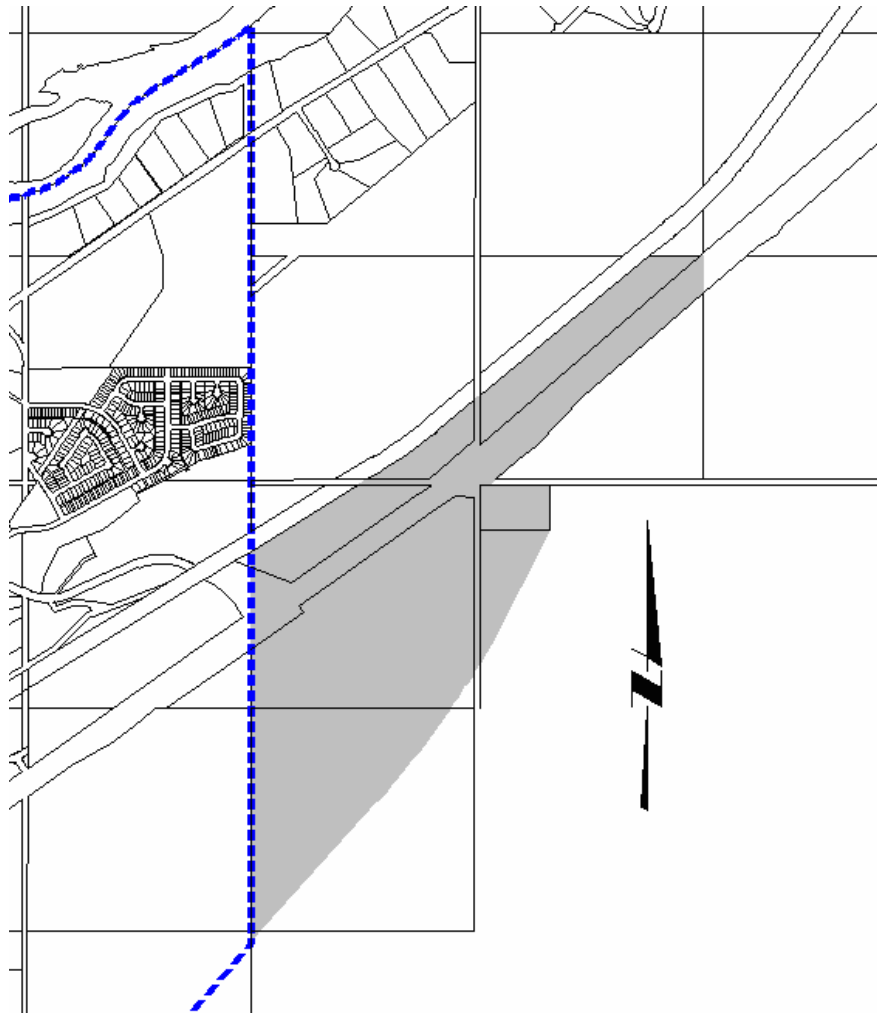

NORTHEAST ANNEXATION AREA**

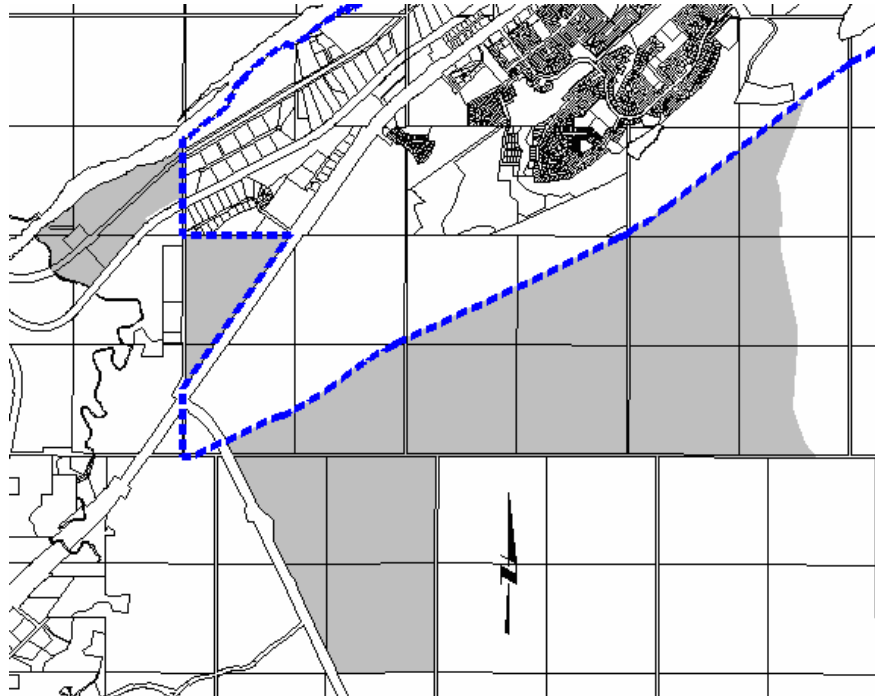

**APPENDIX C
ORDER**

1 In this Order, “annexed land” means the land described in Appendix A and shown on the sketch in Appendix B.

2(1) For the purposes of taxation in 2009 and in each subsequent year up to and including 2023, the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it

- (a) must be assessed by The Town of Hinton on the same basis as if they had remained in Yellowhead County, and
- (b) must be taxed by The Town of Hinton in respect of each assessment class that applies to the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it using
 - (i) the municipal tax rate established by Yellowhead County, unless that rate exceeds the rate established by The Town of Hinton, or

- (ii) the municipal tax rate established by The Town of Hinton, unless that rate exceeds the rate established by Yellowhead County.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), all regulated property as defined in section 1(n) of the Matters Relating to Assessment and Taxation Regulation must be taxed at the municipal tax rates established by The Town of Hinton.

3(1) Where in any taxation year

- (a) a portion of the annexed land becomes a new parcel of land created
 - (i) as a result of subdivision,
 - (ii) as a result of separation of title by registered plan of subdivision, or
 - (iii) by instrument or any other method that occurs at the request of or on behalf of the landowner,
- (b) a portion of the annexed land is redesignated, at the request of or on behalf of the landowner under The Town of Hinton Land Use Bylaw, to a designation other than Future Urban Development,
- (c) a portion of the annexed land is connected to water or sanitary sewer services provided by The Town of Hinton,
- (d) the landowner commences a non temporary use of a parcel of land or of the land on a vacant lot, or
- (e) the landowner increases the intensity or density of the overall use of an already-developed lot or parcel of land,

section 2 ceases to apply at the end of that taxation year in respect of that portion of the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection 3(1)(a), section 2 does not cease to apply if the subdivision is the separation of an existing farmstead from a previously unsubdivided quarter section.

(3) If, under this section, section 2 ceases to apply to a portion of the annexed land in a taxation year, that portion of the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it must be assessed and taxed for the purposes of property taxes in the following year in the same manner as other property of the same assessment class in The Town of Hinton is assessed and taxed.

- (e) the assessor for the Town of Pincher Creek must assess, for the purposes of 2010 and subsequent years, the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it,

and makes the order in Appendix C.

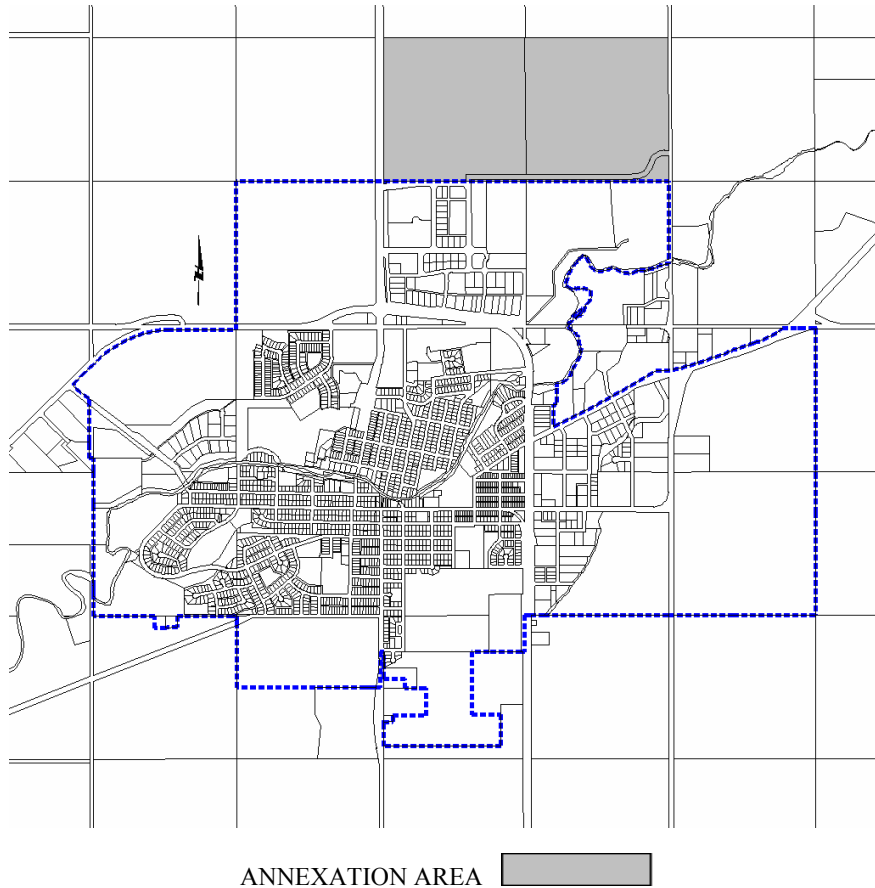

- (a) must be assessed by the Town of Pincher Creek on the same basis as if they had remained in the Municipal District of Pincher Creek No. 9, and
- (b) must be taxed by the Town of Pincher Creek in respect of each assessment class that applies to the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it using the municipal tax rate established by the Municipal District of Pincher Creek No. 9.

- (a) becomes a new parcel of land created as the result of subdivision or separation of title by registered plan of subdivision or by instrument or any other method that occurs at the request of, or on behalf of, the landowner,
- (b) becomes a residual portion of 16 hectares or less after a new parcel referred to in clause (a) has been created,
- (c) is redesignated at the request of, or on behalf of the landowner under the Town of Pincher Creek’s Land Use Bylaw to another designation,
- (d) is the subject of a local improvement project described in a local improvement bylaw initiated by, or with the support of or on behalf of the landowner, pursuant to which the Town of Pincher Creek’s water and sewer services are made available to the land, or
- (e) is connected to the water or sanitary sewer services provided by the Town of Pincher Creek,

section 2 ceases to apply at the end of that taxation year in respect of that portion of the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it.

4 After section 2 ceases to apply to a portion of the annexed land in a taxation year, that portion of the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it must be assessed and taxed for the purposes of property taxes in the following year in the same manner as other property of the same assessment class in the Town of Pincher Creek is assessed and taxed.

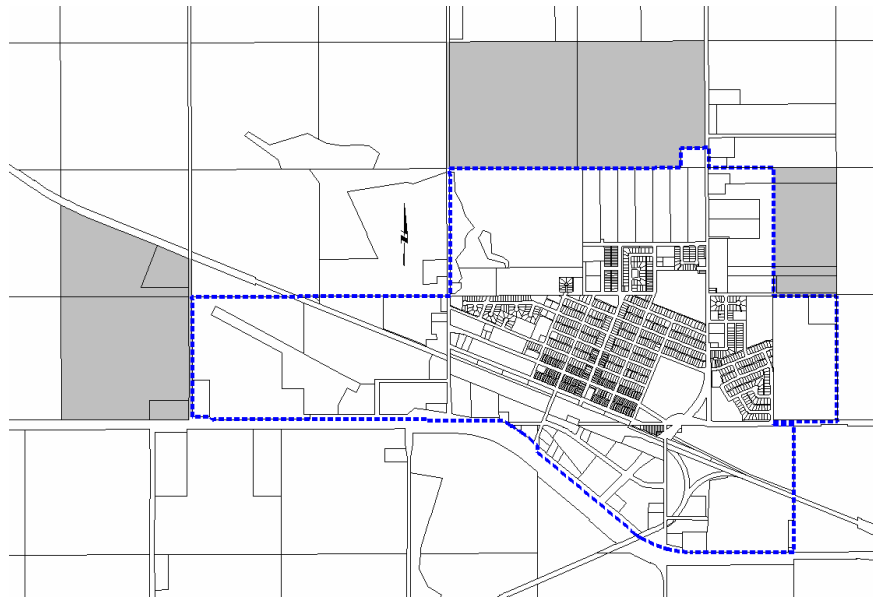

APPENDIX C

ORDER

- 1 In this Order, “annexed land” means the land described in Appendix A and shown on the sketch in Appendix B.
- 2 For the purpose of taxation in 2010 and in each subsequent year up to and including 2024, the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it
 - (a) must be assessed by the Town of Tofield on the same basis as if they had remained in Beaver County, and
 - (b) must be taxed by the Town of Tofield in respect of each assessment class that applies to the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it using the lower of
 - (i) the municipal tax rate established by the Town of Tofield, and
 - (ii) the municipal tax rate established by Beaver County.
- 3(1) Where in any taxation year a portion of the annexed land
 - (a) becomes a new parcel of land created
 - (i) as a result of subdivision,
 - (ii) as a result of separation of title by registered plan of subdivision, or
 - (iii) by instrument or any other method that occurs at the request of or on behalf of the landowner,
 - (b) becomes a residual portion of 16 hectares or less as the result of the creation of a parcel referred to in clause (a),
 - (c) is redesignated, at the request of or on behalf of the landowner under the Town of Tofield Land Use Bylaw, to a designation other than agricultural or urban reserve,
 - (d) is connected to water or sanitary sewer services provided by the Town of Tofield, or
 - (e) becomes the subject of a local improvement project described in a local improvement bylaw initiated by or with the support of the landowner and pursuant to which water or sanitary sewer services provided by the Town of Tofield are made available to the land,

section 2 ceases to apply at the end of that taxation year in respect of that portion of the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection 3(1)(a), section 2 does not cease to apply if the subdivision is the separation of an existing farmstead from a previously unsubdivided quarter section.

(3) If, under this section, section 2 ceases to apply to a portion of the annexed land in a taxation year, that portion of the annexed land and the assessable improvements to it must be assessed and taxed for the purposes of property taxes in the following year in the same manner as other property of the same assessment class in the Town of Tofield is assessed and taxed.
