(Mines and Minerals Act)

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to section 102 of the Mines and Minerals Act, that the Minister of Energy on behalf of the Crown has executed counterparts of the agreement entitled "Amending Agreement –Chigwell Viking Unit No. 4" with respect to M4 R26 T043: 14S, and that the enlargement to Chigwell Viking Unit No. 4 became effective on October 1, 2014.

AMENDING AGREEMENT

"Chigwell Viking Unit No. 4"

WHEREAS the Parties set forth and described in Exhibit "A" (other than Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Alberta) are parties to the Unit Agreement entitled "Chigwell Viking Unit No. 4" effective the 1st day of October, 2010 (including any subsequent amendments or revisions shall hereinafter referred to as the "Unit Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to expand the Unit by including the S/2 of Section 14 in Township 43, Range 26, West of the 4 Meridian; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to make certain amendments to the Unit Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants herein contained, the Parties agree to and with each other that:

- 1) The definitions contained in the Unit Agreement including all attached Exhibits, unless otherwise defined herein, shall be incorporated into and shall apply to this Amending Agreement;
- 2) Article I - Clause 101- Definitions of the Unit Agreement will be amended as follows:

 - Clause 101(w) "Viking Formation" will be replaced with the following:

" means the interval occurring between the depths of 1411.9 metres Kb and 1417.4 metres Kb on the Compensated Neutron/Formation Density Log of Glencoe Chigwell situated in legal subdivision 14 of section 11, township 43, range 26, west of the 4th meridian, as identified in Exhibit "C";

- 3) Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Alberta is a Party as of the effective date hereof;
- 4) Exhibit "A"; Exhibit "A" Part I; and Exhibit "A" Part II – to the Unit Agreement will be replaced with Exhibit "A"; Exhibit "A" Part I and Exhibit "A" Part II attached to and forming part of this Amending Agreement;

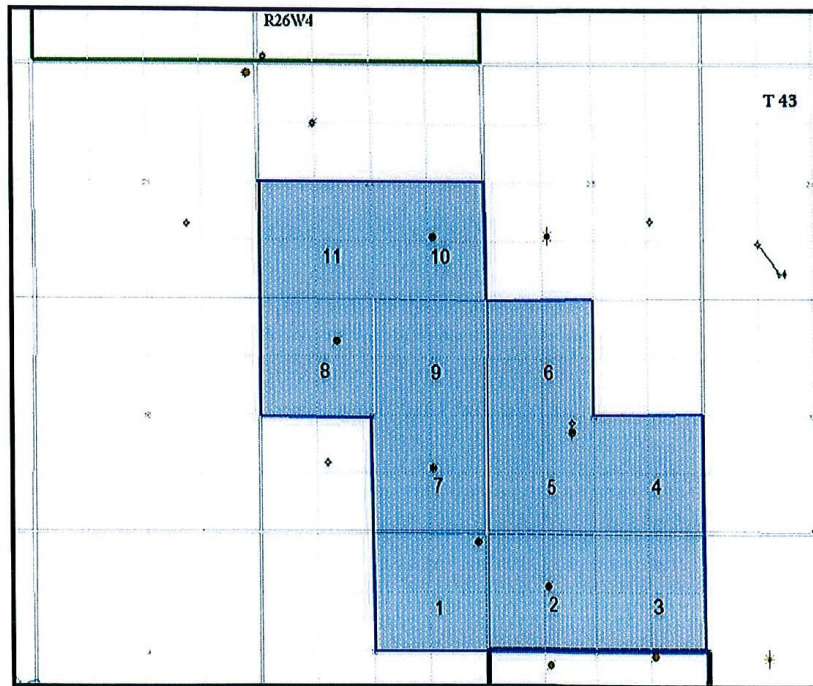

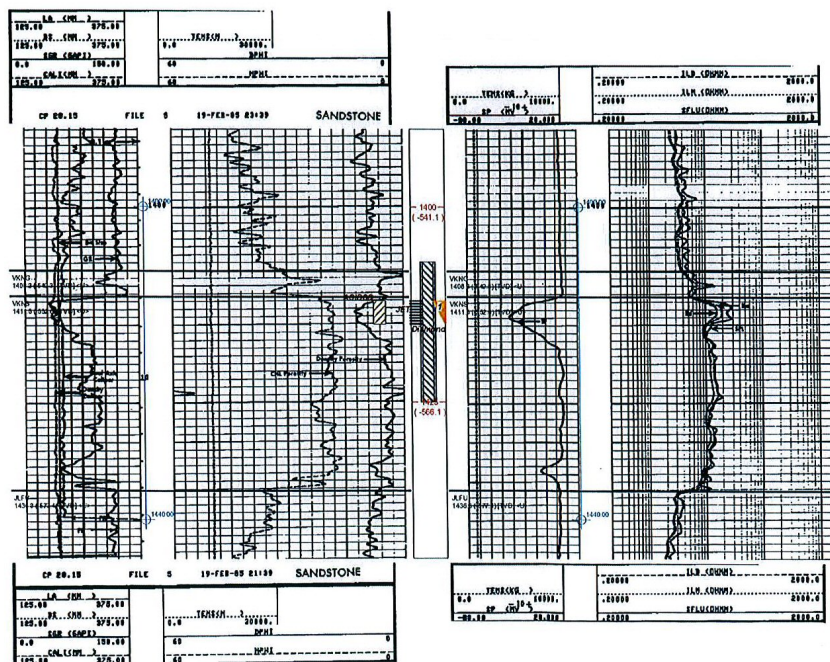
