APPENDIX

Provincial Parks Act

The lands described in the Schedule of Lands are designated as a Provincial Recreation Area to be known as Saskatoon Mountain Provincial Recreation Area.

SCHEDULE OF LANDS

SASKATOON MOUNTAIN PROVINCIAL RECREATION AREA

All those parcels or tracts of land, situate, lying and being in the seventy-second (72) township, in the ninth (9) range, west of the sixth (6) meridian, in the province of Alberta, Canada, and being composed of:

A. Section eleven (11), the north east quarter of section nine (9), the east half and north west quarter of section ten (10), the south half of section fourteen (14), the west half and south east quarter of section fifteen (15) and the south east quarter of section sixteen (16) of the said township.

Saving and Excepting

1. Eight and one hundred twenty-five thousandths (8.125) hectares (20.07 acres) more or less, out of the said north west quarter of section ten (10) being more particularly described as follows; all that portion of a radar sight right-of-way as shown on a plan of survey of record on file in the Land Titles Office at Edmonton for the North Alberta Land Registration District as No. 862 2503, which lies east of a surveyed right-of-way as shown on a plan of survey of record in the said Land Titles Office as No. 872 2279.

2. Three hundred seventy-two thousandths (0.372) hectares (0.92 acres) more or less, out of the south east quarter of the said section ten (10) required for a mobile radio station site as shown on a plan of survey of record on file in the said Land Titles Office as No. 2891JY.

3. One and two hundred seventy-five thousandths (1.275) hectares (3.15 acres) more or less, out of the south west quarter of the said section eleven (11), required for Parcel 'A', as shown on a plan of survey of record on file in the said Land Titles Office as No. 31KS.

B. The statutory road allowance adjoining the north boundaries of sections ten (10), eleven (11) and the north east quarter of section nine (9), the statutory road allowance and intersection adjoining the west boundaries of the north west quarter of section ten (10) and the south west quarter of section fifteen (15) and

the southernmost 365.75 meters of the statutory road allowance adjoining the west boundary of legal subdivision four (4) of the said section eleven (11).

The lands herein described contain nine hundred ten and one hundred seventy thousandths (910.170) hectares (2,249.08 acres), more or less.

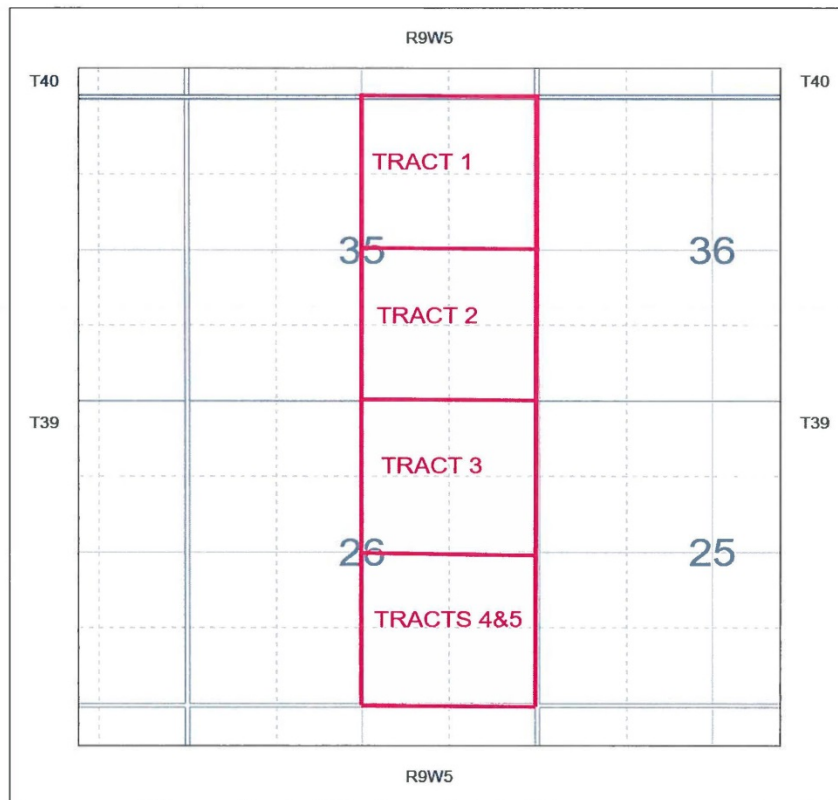

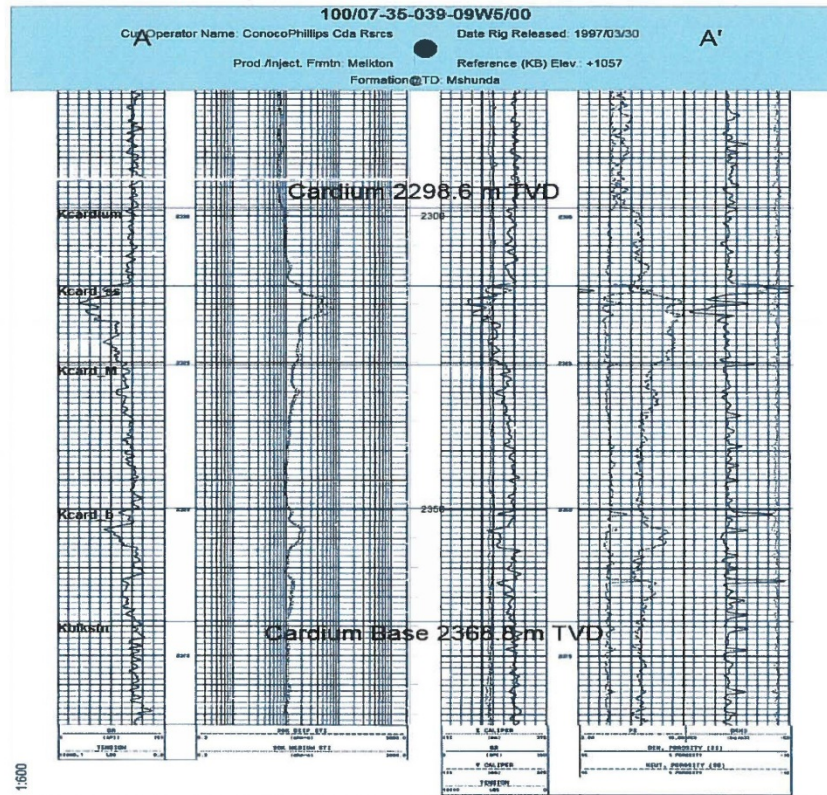
