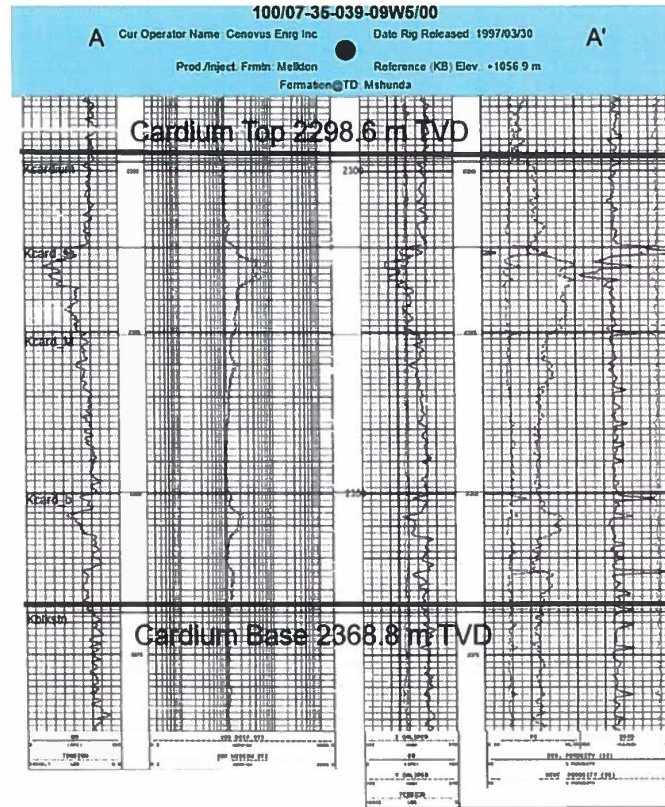

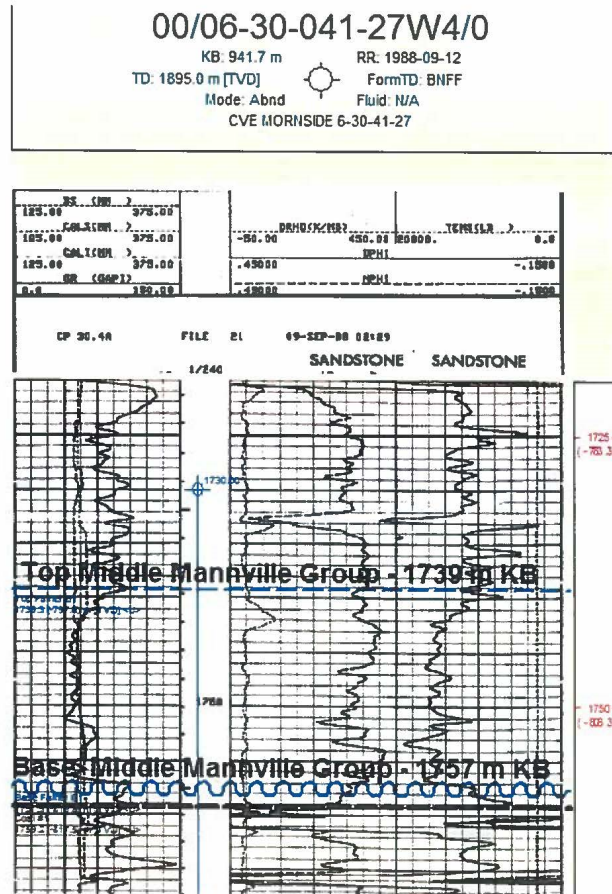

Interception of private communication is very important for detection, prevention and investigation of serious criminal offences.

One example provided by a law enforcement agency was a particular cold-case murder investigation in which wiretap provided significant information to allow investigators to change their focus away from previously targeted individuals. In terms of wiretap, it was a success even though no convictions resulted.
