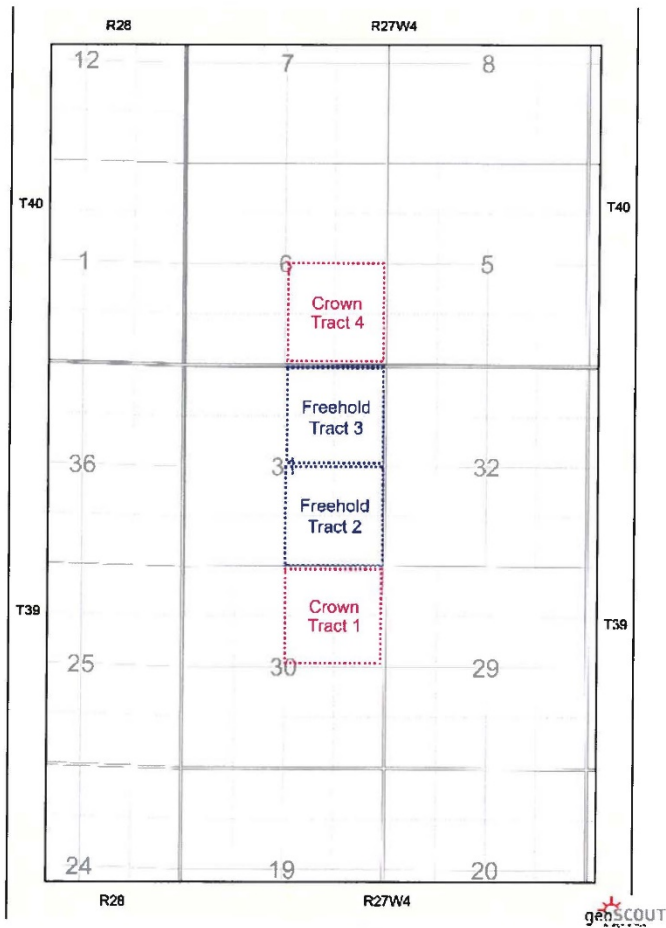

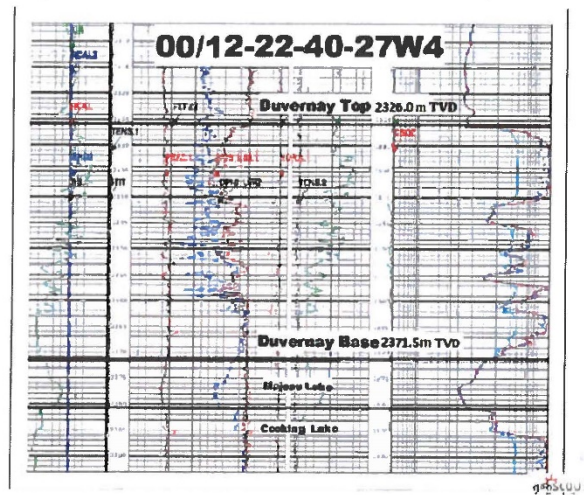

A portion of the Density Neutron Log recorded at the well 100/12-22-040-27W4/00 located in LSD 12.

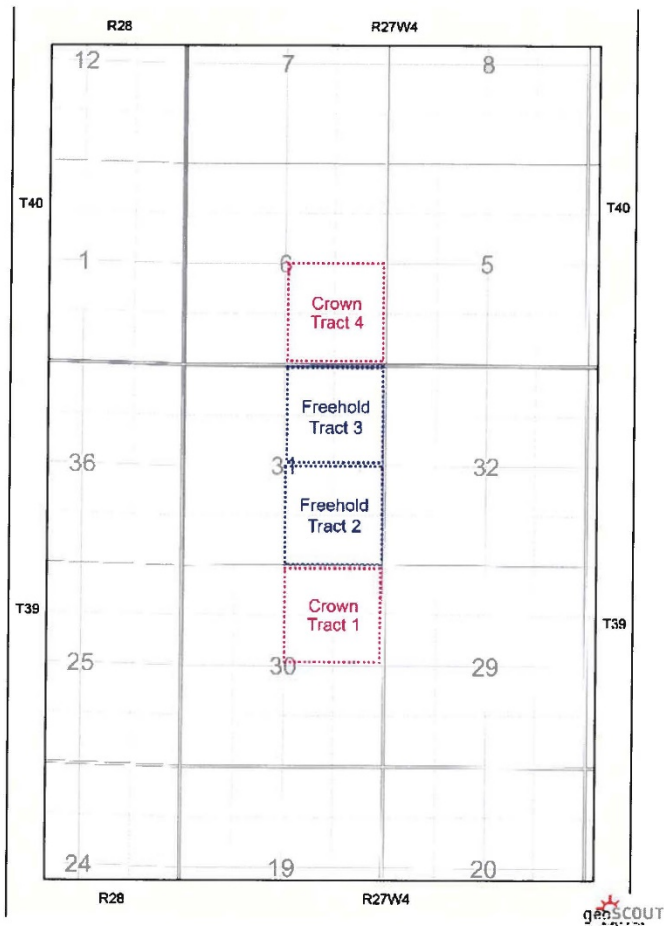

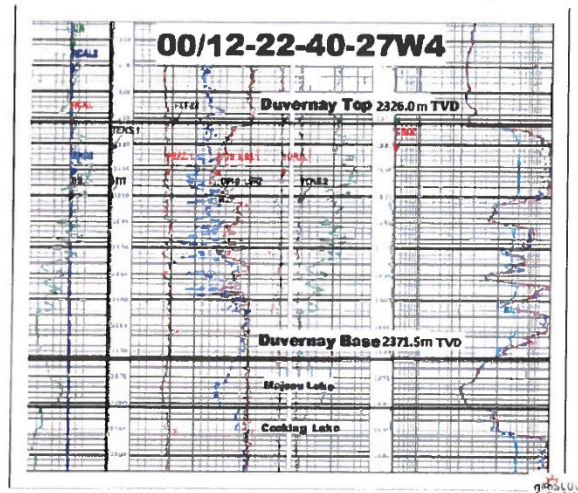

A portion of the Density Neutron Log recorded at the well 100/12-22-040-27W4/00 located in LSD 12.

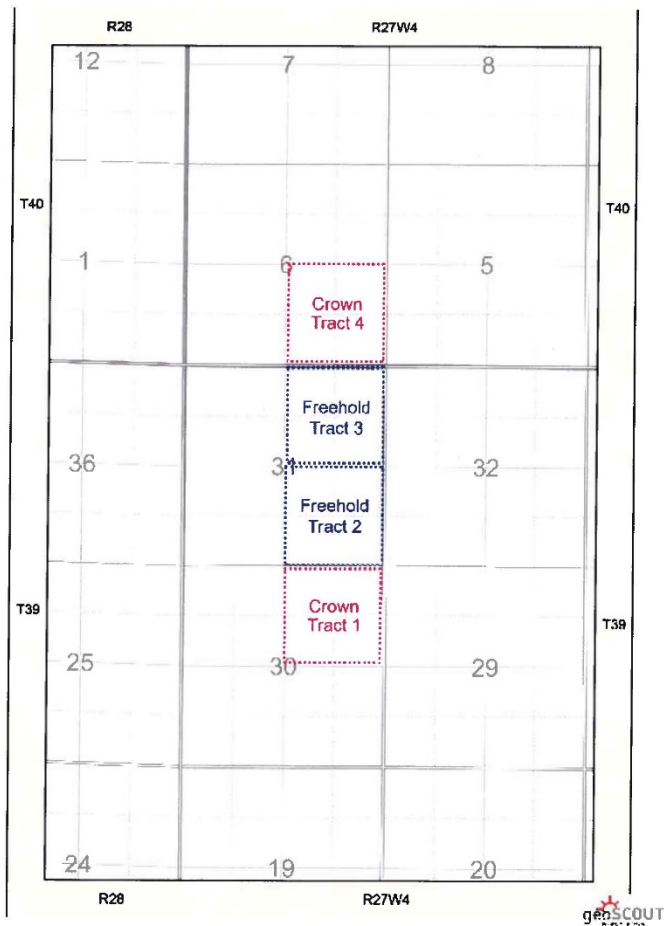

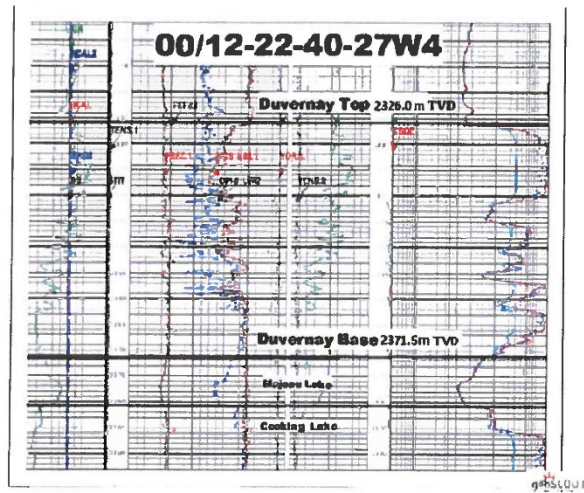

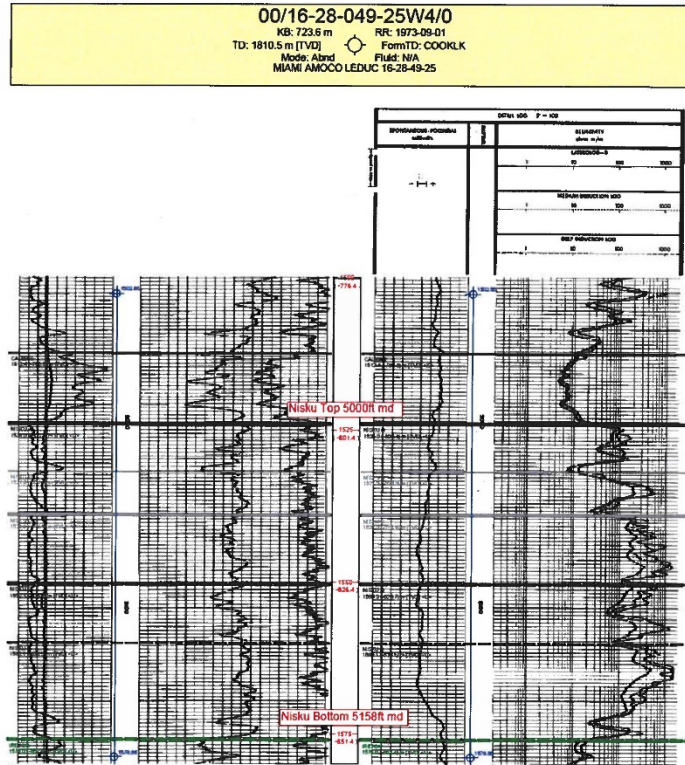
