The revised Specified Gas Reporting Standard has been released for the 2020 emissions reporting period.

A facility that meets or exceeds 10,000 tonnes of CO₂ equivalent emissions must submit a Specified Gas Report to Alberta Environment and Parks through ECCC's Single Window Information Management (SWIM) system. The link to the system is provided here: <https://ec.ss.ec.gc.ca/>.

The Specified Gas Report must be submitted in accordance with the requirements set out in the Specified Gas Reporting Regulation and Specified Gas Reporting Standard. The report for the 2020 period must be submitted by no later than June 1, 2021.
